SPECIAL MEETING

Mayor Paulson called the special meeting to order at 5:30 P.M.

- 4.1 INTRODUCTION AND FIRST READING OF ORDINANCE 1064, A REUSABLE FOODWARE ORDINANCE REQUIRING ALL FOOD FACILITY VENDORS TO USE REUSABLE FOODWARE FOR DINE-IN OPERATIONS AND COMPLIANT COMPOSTABLE FOODWARE FOR TAKE-OUT SERVICES

Council to conduct the public hearing and consider a motion to introduce and waive first reading of Ordinance 1064.

City Manager Schwarz provided a staff report and answered questions from the Council.

Seeing no one else wishing to speak, Mayor Paulson closed the public hearing.


Upon motion by Councilmember Haroff, and seconded by Vice Mayor Candell, the City Council introduced and waived first reading of Ordinance 1064, a Reusable Foodware Ordinance requiring all food facility vendors to use reusable foodware for dine-in operations and compliant compostable foodware for take-out services. The vote was unanimously in favor. The second reading and adoption of Ordinance 1064 will be scheduled for the next regular meeting of the City Council, currently scheduled for May 3, 2023.
