I need to express my opposition to the City of Larkspur waving \$275,000 of fees to 1251 South Eliseo Drive development.

If you ask the right questions and listen to what this project is, you will know and understand community safety is a concern. You also know the Community Service Safety Team is a joke. ECS has not identified funding, CSS Team is not normally part of what ECS provided, this ROBUST CSS Team is one individual when children are coming and going to school, if ECS loses funding, the CSS Team goes away. How can Larkspur City Council overlook this key piece of information?

The lack of a Community Service Safety Team is known by Marin County Board of Supervisors and Larkspur City Council. I spoke with Mr. Haroff regarding this matter, February 9, 2022. Mrs. Way is a member of the Community Advisory Group for 1251 South Eliseo Drive, she is aware of the "deficiencies" of the Community Service Safety Team.

Why on earth would Larkspur City Council wave \$275,000 of fees to develop a permanent supportive housing facility, housing 16 residents with severe mental illness, an additional 27 individuals with mental illness, and addiction issues. Apply the \$275,000 for law enforcement to protect the community?

Has anyone on Larkspur City Council read from the ECS website: ECS June 30, 2021, Independent Auditors' Report and Consolidated Financial Statements and Supplementary Information?

ECS received more than \$3.3 million in PPP funding which was forgiven.

ECS net assets at the end of 2021 was \$87 million.

ECS can afford the \$275,000 permit fees. The City of Larkspur will no doubt need the revenue to cover the cost of community safety.
